CHRISTMAS POINSETTIA CUP COASTER ITH - 3 SIZES



HOW TO CREATE, A STEP-BY-STEP PROCESS

Our PLACEMATS use the same principle as the ornamental placemat, so we provide SIMILAR instructions FOR ALL OUR PLACEMATS.

This cup coaster is embroidered in the hoop. The stabilizer will remain inside the cup coaster. You will not need to cut anything and receive the finished product.

Before you start, wash the fabric you will use for the cup coaster. The instructions for our cup coaster are almost identical, so we use instructions for the Andalusian napkin.


Follow those instructions, and you will get a beautiful, high-quality product.

1. You need to take two pieces of tear-away stabilizer. They should be bigger than your hoop. Put the two pieces together, spray temporary adhesive on top of it, and place the fabric on top of the stabilizer. Hoop the stabilizer and fabric together in the hoop.



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2. Embroider. Stop the machine when it is about to embroider the outline (we have it marked in bright green).



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3. Remove the hoop from the machine. Flip it over as shown in the image. You need to place a piece of fabric on the backside of the embroidery. This will be the reverse side of the coaster.



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4. Spray adhesive on the back of the embroidery and place a piece of fabric on it. This will be the reverse side of the coaster.




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5. Place the hoop with the fabric back into the machine. Embroider the outline using the thread that matches the fabric color.



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6. Trim the fabric close to the outline on both sides.



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- 7. Continue embroidering to the end.
- 8. Tear off the excess stabilizer.
